**NH Bond in Pyrrole**

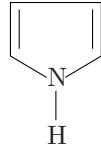

**Question:**

The command `\pyrrolev{1==H}` gives the following formula:



How can we omit the single bond symbol (—) in the N—H of the formula?

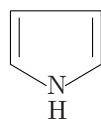
**Answer:**

Use a more basic command `\fiveheterov` in place of the `\pyrrolev`. And then the unit NH is drawn by using `\downnobond` as follows:

```
%setting in the preamble
%\usepackage{xymtexps}
%\usepackage{chmst-ps}
%\verb$switchfalse

\fiveheterov[bd]{1==\downnobond{N}{H}}{}
```

This code prints out the following structural formula:



On the same line, an inverse vertical formula of pyrrole can be drawn by writing the following code:

```
%setting in the preamble
%\usepackage{xymtexps}
%\usepackage{chmst-ps}
%\verb$switchfalse

\fiveheterovi[bd]{1==\upnobond{N}{H}}{}
```

where the inverse type of NH is specified by using \upnobond. Thereby we can obtain the following structural formula:
